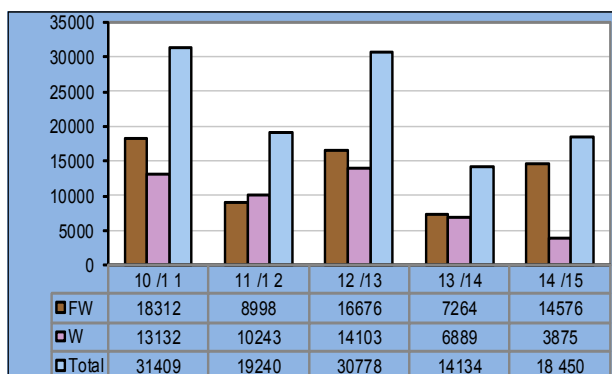


## I. Export Agriculture

### I.1 2014/2015 coffee Season

The production of the 2014/2015 coffee season increased significantly compared to the previous campaign. Indeed, the total production of parchment Arabica Coffee amounted to 18,450 vs 14,134 T, reflecting an increase of 30.5 p.c. following the cyclicity of coffee yield.

**Chart 1: Production of parchment Arabica Coffee at the end of March (tons)**

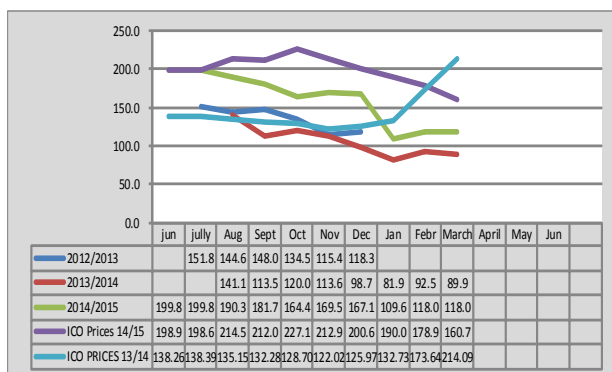


In terms of quality, the share of fully washed coffee in parchment progressed significantly, settling at 79.5 percent against 51.3 percent in the previous season.

Regarding the green coffee, the volume produced at the end of March 2015, reached 14,923 against 10,769 T at the same period of the previous year, this is a 38.6 p.c. increase.

Concerning the sale of green coffee, the quantity of 2014/2015 campaign sold at the end of March 2015 amounted 13.884 for BIF 81.222,7 million vs 9.881 T and BIF 36.720,8 million respectively at the corresponding period of last year. The average price reached 166.7 against 106.4 cts/lb the previous period.

The improvement of coffee revenue is attributed to increase in production and prices. Indeed, the average price of Arabica coffee "Other mild" on the New York market rose from 144.2 to 197.62. cts/lb one period to another.

### I.2 TEA

The tea leaves production of the first quarter of the year 2015 rose by 8.0 per cent compared to the corresponding period of 2014, reaching 16.098 against 14.910 tons, in relation to good rainfall. This development concerned the tea complex of Rwegura (15.3 p.c.), Ijenda (6.3 p.c.), Teza (11.0 p.c.) and Buhoro (7.6 p.c.).

Similarly, the quantity of dry tea obtained after machining increased by 8.2 p.c., standing at 3.386 from 3, 131 T. The average milling yield remained at 21.0 percent.

Regarding the sale, the volume of dry tea sold at the end of March 2015 progressed by 35.4 percent, reaching 3.277 against 2.421 T in the same period of last year. Thus, the sale income progressed by 50.4 p.c., attaining BIF 13,068 million against BIF 8,687 million in relation with the amelioration of prices (BIF/Kg 3,987 against BIF/Kg 3,589 ).

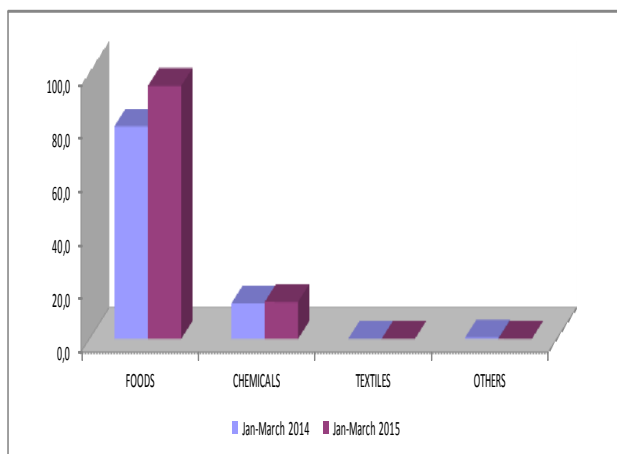

## II. INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION

The industrial sector recorded an increase in production compared to the same quarter the previous year. In fact, the index of industrial production increased by 16.6 per cent, from 93.4 to 108.9, in conjunction with the augmentation of the production in the branches of food (19.2 pc) and chemical industries (4.4 pc).

**Chart 3: Quarterly development in the weighted index of the industrial production**



The raise of the activity of food industries is essentially linked to the increase in the production of beverage BRARUDI (3.2 pc) and cigarettes (160.5 pc)

The increase in production in the sector of the chemical is due mainly to the increase in production of paint (2.7 pc), oxygen (49.8 pc) and plastic crates (66.1 pc).

The production in the sector of construction materials industries has declined due to the decrease in the production of PVC pipes (-87.1 pc).

## III. CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

### Quarterly Evolution

The first quarter 2015 recorded an inflation rate of 3.1 against 5.2 pc in the same period of 2014. This decline is mainly due to the decrease in food prices (-0.9 against 4.9 pc) partially offset by higher prices in non-food sector (6.2 against 5.2 pc). The price's decline in food sector was mainly due to falling prices of the divisions "vegetables"(-9.9 pc), "Sugar, jam, honey, chocolate and confectionery (-4.3 pc) and" Oils and fats "(-0.8 pc).

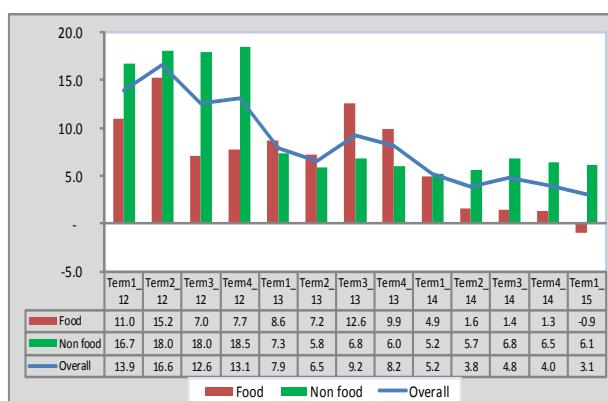

That inflation for non-food sector resulted from higher prices in following divisions: "clothing and footwear" (13.2 against 4.9 pc), "health" (8.3 against 6.9 pc), "communication" (17.6 against 0.1 pc), "education" (3.0 pc against 0), "housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels" (5, 4 against 5.2 pc). Compared to the previous quarter, the inflation rate for the first quarter 2015 decelerated (3.1 against 4.0 pc) in line with the decline in food prices (-0.9 against 0.6 pc).

**Chart 4: Quarterly evolution of inflation (in percentage)**



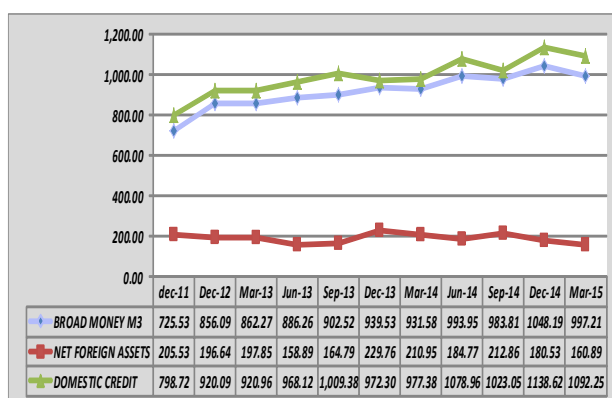
## IV. MONETARY SURVEY

### IV.1. Money supply M3 and its counterparties

#### a. Quarterly evolution

At the end of the first quarter of fiscal year 2015, the Money Supply M3 depleted up to BIF 50,983.2 million or -4.9 pc, with respect to the enhancement recorded at the end of December 2014, falling from BIF 1,048,189.7 to 997,206.5 million.

The Money Supply M3 tightening is linked to the contraction of both M2 and deposits of residents in foreign currency respectively by BIF 35,918.8 and 15,064.4 million.

The declining Money Supply M2 is due to the contraction of the Narrow Money M1 (by BIF 44,630.9 million), the Savings and Term Deposits instead rose by BIF 8,712.1 million. The contraction in the Narrow Money M1 concerned both, the Currency in Circulation out of Banks (-BIF 5,198.9 million) and Demand Deposits (-BIF 39,432.0 million).

The contraction in the Demand Deposits denominated in domestic currency was due to the decline in the private non-financial corporations deposits (-BIF 31,985.6 million), in household deposits (-BIF 3,772.4 million) and those included in "Other Accounts" (-BIF 7,828.2 million). The deposits of other financial intermediaries (-BIF 219.9 million) and of local government (-BIF 846.9 million) shrank as well. In return, the deposits of Public Non-financial Corporations (+BIF 277.6 million) slightly went up.

The progress in the Time Deposits and Savings denominated in domestic currency is related to the increase in deposits included in "Other Accounts" (+BIF 5,626.0 million), the Household deposits (+BIF 3,350.8 million) and other financial intermediaries deposits (+BIF 1,253.6 million) as well as those of private non-financial corporations (+BIF 225.9 million). On the other hand, deposits of the public non-financial corporation depleted by BIF 2,231.2 million.

The contraction in deposits of residents denominated in foreign currency resulted from the regress in the deposits of private non-financial corporations (-BIF 12,050.5 million), the household deposits (-BIF 3,221.3 million) and those included in "Other Account" (-BIF 638.1 million). In contrast, those of public non-financial corporations increased by BIF 845.5 million.

The decline in net foreign assets (-BIF 19,637.5 million), in the claims on the economy (-BIF 7,949.1 million), in the net claims on the government (-BIF 38,422.5 million) and other items net (-BIF 15,025.9 million) is the main origin of the money supply shrinkage.

The narrowing of net claims on the government is mainly due to the decrease in the credit allocated by the central bank to the government (-BIF 35,663.1 million) and to the progress in the central government deposits (+BIF 14,418.1 million) that widely exceeded the increase in claims of the commercial bank on the government (+BIF 11,658.7 million).

The recoil of the claims on the economy concerned long run financings (-BIF 5,734.4 million), the import credit (-BIF 2,892.9 million), treasury financings (-BIF 2,600.3 million) as well as export financings (-BIF 240.4 million). In return, middle term financings and other claims increased by BIF 4,733.3 and 3,114.1 million respectively.

From December 2014 to March 2015, the net foreign assets decreased by BIF 19,637.5 million, regress from BIF 180,528.5 to 160,891.0 million (or-10.9 p.c.). This downturn concerned both the net foreign assets held by the central bank (-BIF 13,149.5 million) and the commercial bank (-BIF 6,488.0 million) as well.

Quarter-on-quarter basis, the Net Foreign Exchange Reserves expressed in US dollars, decreased by 11.0 per cent, fallen from USD 116.2 to 103.4 million.\*

## IV.2. Bank Liquidity

At the end of March 2015, the banking sector liquidity shrank by BIF 49,253.1 million with respect to the level recorded at the end of the previous quarter. This reduction is due to the restrictive effect resulted from the decrease in net government debt up to BIF 47,897.2 million and net foreign assets (-BIF 13,149.5 million) that exceeded the expansive impact exerted by Other Items net (+BIF 7,629.3 million) as well as the withdrawal of the currency in circulation out of Central bank (-BIF 4,164.3 million).

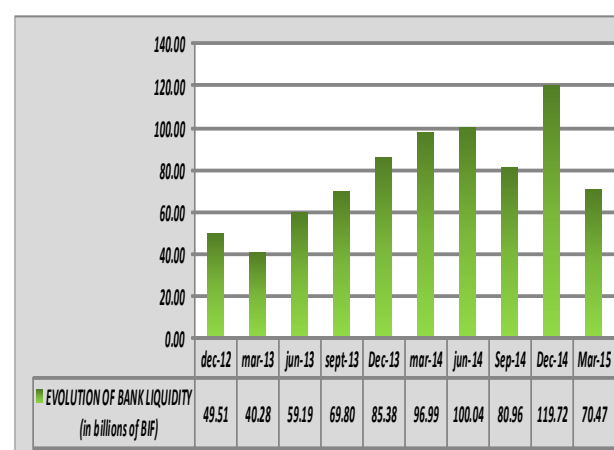

Due to such decrease of the banking sector liquidity, the central bank proceed to the injection of liquidity (+ BIF 1,178.9 million) and commercial banks drawn on their reserves (- BIF 39,312.3 million).

## V. PUBLIC FINANCE

### V.1. Tax revenue

At the end of the first quarter 2015, the total budget revenue stood at BIF 168,308.1 Million against 142,054.7 Million in the period of the preceding fiscal year denoting an 18.5 percent increase. This improvement concerned tax revenues for 23.3 per cent. The exceptional and non tax revenues were decreased by 59.3 and 5.3 percent, respectively.

### V.2. Expenses

During the first quarter 2015, the total Public expenses on commitment basis attained BIF 283,664.0 Million against 279,981.7 Million the corresponding period in 2014, or 1.3 percent increase. The current expenses increased by BIF 34,530.7 Million, while the capital expenses decreased by BIF 30,848.3 Million.

The disequilibrium between revenue and expenses resulted in a fiscal deficit excluding grants during the first quarter 2015; standing at BIF 115,355.9 Million against BIF 137,927.0 Million during the first quarter 2014, and in the fiscal deficit including grants amounted to BIF 39,733.0 Million against BIF 90,461.0 Million.

### V. 3. Domestic debt

At the end of the first quarter 2015, the stock of domestic debt expanded by BIF 99,798.6 Million or 16.5 percent relative to the same period of the preceding fiscal year, from BIF 603,825.4 Million up to BIF 730,624.0 Million.

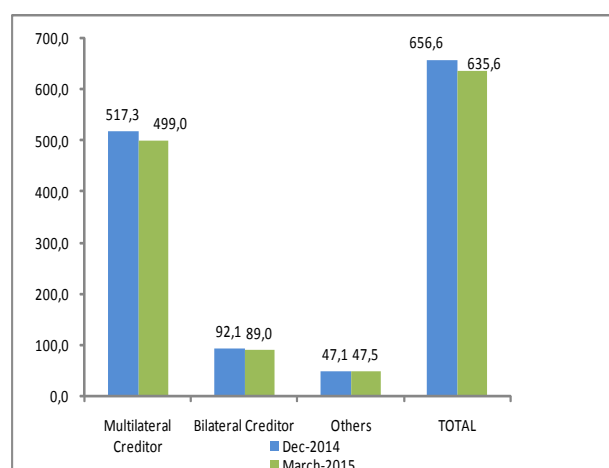
This development concerned both Government debt to the banking sector and non-banking sector that increased by BIF 97,202.2 Million and BIF 2,596.4 Million respectively.

On the other hand, the stock of domestic debt decreased by BIF 26,493.7 Million from BIF 730,117.7 Million the first quarter 2014 to BIF 703,624.0 Million. This decrease was mainly due to the reduction in Government debt to both banking sector (-BIF 56,100.6 Million) and non-banking sector (-BIF 5,062.9 Million).

### V.4. External debt

The stock of external debt at the end of the first quarter 2015 decreased by BIF 21,011.4 Million compared to the preceding quarter, from BIF 656,563.7 Million to BIF 635,552.2 Million.

The reduction in external debt recorded in the first quarter 2015 was mainly due to revaluation gains of BIF 19,958.1 Million that resulted from the depreciation of the euro against the BIF, and the principal repayment of BIF 1,475.4 Million which both outweighed BIF 422.1 Million of drawings.

Drawings made in the first quarter 2015 were allocated to the Sectors of Agriculture and Hydropower. The first Sector was financed by OPEC for BIF 136.7 Million; the second was financed by Exim bank for BIF 285.3 Million.

The stock of external debt expressed in US dollars in the first quarter 2015 decreased by USD 14.3 million, year on year, from USD 422.9 to 408.6 million.

## VI. BALANCE OF SETTLEMENTS

### Quarterly evolution

During the first quarter 2015, the balance of settlements recorded a surplus of BIF 17,418.3 million against a deficit of BIF 71,109.5 million in the same period of 2014. This can be explained by the reduction in the deficit of current account (-BIF 20,306.6 million against -BIF 101,198.9 million) and by the surplus of the capital and financial account (BIF 37,724.3 million against BIF 43,211.5 million).

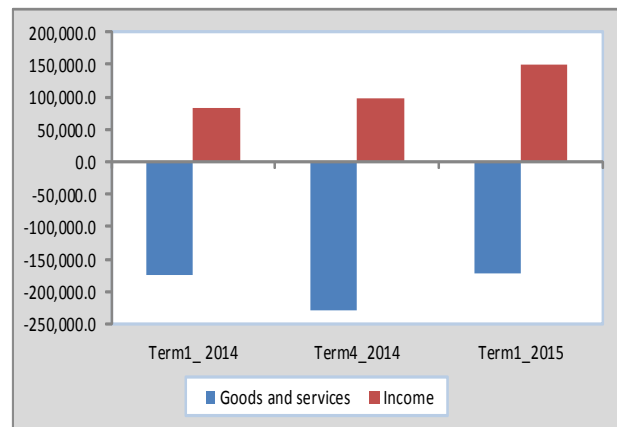

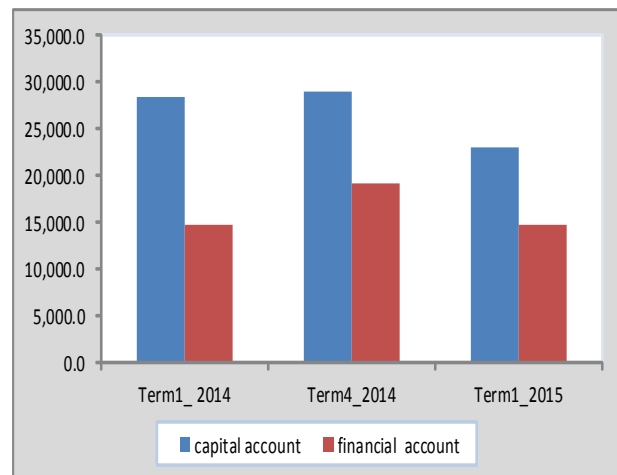
The decline in the current deficit was mainly due to the increase in the balance of secondary incomes (BIF 150,202.2 against 72,667.2 million); the goods and services account hardly varied at all (-BIF 146,113.4 million against -BIF 146,123.4 million).

Regarding capital movements, they recorded a surplus of BIF 37,724.9 million against BIF 43,211, 5 million due to the lower project grants (BIF 23,007.6 against 28,422.2 million) and foreign direct investment (BIF 11,308.2 million against BIF 14,380.2 million).

## I. PRODUCTION AND SALE OF SOME PRODUCTS

### TABLES I.1. & I.2:

#### Production of Arabica coffee by campaign and statement of sales

The two tables provide information on the cumulative production of parchment and machined coffee by campaign and the statement of sale contracts. They are established from data on coffee sector sent monthly by the coffee company (ARFIC).

### TABLES I.3. & I.4:

#### Production of tea leaves and dried tea, monthly sales in quantity, value and prices

These tables show the harvest of tea leaves, the production of dry tea and the dry tea sales. They are derived from the monthly activity reports assigned by the Burundi Tea Authority.

This table is elaborated from data collected from the main industrial enterprises. The productions are regrouped within the food, chemical and materials of construction industries.

### TABLE I.6:

#### Weighted index of the industrial production

The table indicates the relative proportion of the weighted index of food, chemical, textile and other industries in the general index of the industrial production.

This index is computed on basis of the weighting coefficients representing the contribution of each product in the total added value of the branch. These coefficients are extracted from results of the survey carried out in 1989 on commercial and industrial enterprises.

### TABLES I.7 & I.8:

#### Production and consumption of electric energy

The table I.7 shows the national production of electricity by hydroelectric power station. The table I.8 indicates the electric energy consumption by main urban centers. These data are provided by REGIDESO.

## II. MONEY AND CREDIT

### II.1. COVERAGE

#### II.1.1. Central Bank

The Central Bank is a monetary authority whose fundamental functions are: define and implement monetary and exchange rate policies, to regulate and supervise financial sector, issue currency, manage international reserves as well as to provide loans to other deposit corporations under the charge of the Central Bank.

#### II.1.2. Commercial Banks

Commercial Banks are Institutions that collect demand deposits that can be transferred by check or used as any other direct or long term means of payment, they are also involved in credit operations.

Institutions registered as commercial banks until now are:

Banque de Crédit de Bujumbura (BCB), Banque Commerciale du Burundi (BANCOBU), Inter Bank Burundi (IBB), Banque de Gestion et de Financement (BGF), Finlease Bank (FINBANK), Banque Burundaise pour le Commerce et l'investissement (BBCI), Diamond Trust Bank Burundi (DTB), Kenya Commercial Bank Burundi (KCB Bank Burundi), Cooperative for Rural Development Bank (CRDB Bank Burundi) and ECOBANK Burundi.

Data on DTB, KCB Bank Burundi LMT and CRDB Bank Burundi are integrated in commercial banks statistics since June 2009, July 2012 and December 2012 respectively.

#### II.1.3. Other Financial Intermediaries

As by their usual profession, the other financial intermediaries give loans. They are allowed to borrow without having neither counters nor accounts for the clientele. The institutions registered in this category are Banque Nationale pour le Développement Economique (BNDE) and Fonds de Promotion de l'Habitat Urbain (FPHU).

## II.1. CONTENTS OF TABLES

### TABLE II.1: FOREIGN EXCHANGE RESERVES

Foreign exchange reserves are given by the sum of foreign assets of the BRB and Commercial Banks minus their external liabilities. The external reserves of the Central Bank regard only the foreign exchange reserves that the Bank can freely have at its disposal including foreign currencies, monetary Gold, SDR and the IMF reserve position in IMF.

### TABLES II.2.1 & II.2.2: Balance sheet of BRB

The table shows the Central Bank's balance sheet as stated at the end of each month. In the liabilities side, this statement shows all the liabilities of the Central Bank as monetary authority while the assets side indicates the counterparts of those liabilities. The item "foreign assets" includes among others, demand and time deposits, currencies, IMF reserve position which is the difference between Burundi's share in the IMF (the account IMF n°1) and IMF securities account.

### TABLES II.3.1 & II.3.2: Balance sheet of commercial banks

The tables show the consolidation of balance sheets of all commercial banks.

### TABLES II.4.1 & II.4.2: Monetary survey

The Tables indicate the consolidation of assets and liabilities of BRB, commercial banks and Postal Checking Accounts. The asset represents counterparts of broad money (M2) which are: net foreign assets and domestic credit. In turn, liability shows broad money and net other items.

### TABLES II.5: Base money, broad money and evolution of the money multiplier

The table shows the evolution of base money and its counterparts, broad money (M2) and money multiplier, which is the ratio between broad money and monetary base.

The tables show the consolidation of assets and liabilities of BNDE and FPHU.

### TABLES II.7.1 & II.7.2: Consolidated balance sheet of financial system

The table indicates autonomous factors of the banking liquidity which appear on the balance sheet of the BRB. Autonomous factors are those beyond direct control of Central Bank.

The table informs on deposits broken down by term and holder. These deposits are used to calculate broad money.

### TABLE II.10: Breakdown of time deposits and other resources of commercial banks

The table shows the evolution of all time deposits and other resources of commercial banks by term.

The table highlights the outstanding credits to economy (including unpaid loans) and signature commitments of commercial banks and financial establishments. Loans are divided in category and term.

The table indicates the evolution of credits according to activity sectors.

The table shows the external financing operations (drawings, interest payment and principal repayment as well as revaluation).

## IV. FOREIGN TRADE

The compilation of foreign trade statistics refers to the elaboration of tables of imports (in volume and value CIF) and exports (in volume and value FOB Bujumbura) of goods and services.

Tables of imports and exports are set according:

1. The nomenclature of the International Convention on the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System.

2. Destination sectors of imports (consumption, equipment and production) and the nature of export products (Primary, manufacturing and others).

3. Countries of origin for imports and countries of destination for the exports.  
Statistics on foreign trade are elaborated from customs data, coffee auction and sale contracts for tea side.

4. International transactions include all transactions between residents and non-residents according to the Manual of the balance of payments (BPM6).

## V. MISCELLANEOUS STATISTICS

### TABLE V.1: Traffic in the port of Bujumbura

The table shows the traffic in the port of Bujumbura by gross volume of entries and exits of goods.

### TABLE V.2: Entries and exits of goods in the port of Bujumbura

In relation to the previous table, this table shows the evolution on five years, of entries and exits of goods (in volume) in the port of Bujumbura. Entries are grouped in food, chemical and textile industries, fuel and lubricants, equipment materials, vehicles and other products.

### TABLE V.3: Traffic in the international airport of Bujumbura

The table gives the traffic (arrivals and departures not including the transit) in the international Airport of Bujumbura. It shows the number of passengers, the tonnage of the baggage and freight as well as the volume of the postal mail.

### TABLES V.4, V.5. & V.6: Entries, consumption and stock of the main oil products

These tables inform respectively on the volume of entries, the consumption and the available stock of fuel, petrol, gas oil and J.P.1 in the Company of storage of Oil Products "SEP".

### Table V.7: Price statistics

Statistics on prices are compiled on the basis of surveys of prices carried out by ISTEERU on different markets of Bujumbura Capital. The food basket consists of items divided into eight groups as follows:

1. Food products and soft drinks;
2. Alcoholic drinks and tobacco;
3. Clothing and footwear;
4. Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels;
5. Furnishings, household equipment and routine household maintenance
6. Health;
7. Transport;
8. Communication;
9. Leisure
10. Education;
11. Hotel, cafes and restoration
12. Other goods and services.

This classification was adopted in December 2013 to comply with international classification (COICOP).

### TABLES V.8, V.9 and V.10: Statistics of exchange rate

Statistics on exchange rates cover the main currencies quoted with uncertainty by the Central Bank. The Research and Statistics department uses exchange rates and price index of the various partners of Burundi in the calculation of nominal and real effective exchange rates of Burundi Franc.
